| GREEN ZONE = GOOD | GREEN ZONE MEANS |
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| Vital Signs Normal. No Shortness of Breath. Activity Level Normal. Normal Urine Output. Skin Pink, Warm, and Dry. Alert and Oriented. | Good Hygiene. Proper Hand Washing. Avoid Sources of Infection. Vaccines (Influenza and Pneumonia). Keep your Home Care Nurse appointments. Keep Physician Appointments |
| YELLOW ZONE = CAUTION | YELLOW ZONE MEANS |
| Fever greater than 101F or less than or equal to 96.8F. Rapid Heart Rate. Rapid Respiratory Rate. Increased WBC count indicating infection. Elevated Blood glucose in non-diabetic patient. | Your symptoms may indicate that you may have SEPSIS. | RED ZONE = EMERGENCY | RED ZONE MEANS |
| Respiratory: Severe shortness of breath with oxygen levels less than 90% OR requiring increases in supplemental oxygen. Cardiovascular: Low Blood Pressure (less than 90/40). Renal: Significantly decreased urine output. Neurological: Increase in confusion. Abnormal blood work (Low Platelets, High INR, High Total Serum Bilirubin, High Serum Lactic Acid). | This indicates that you need to be evaluated by your physician right away. Primary MD: |
